MUSELLMAN TO TALK ROADS AT NEXT FCA MEETING

Springfield Township public services director John Musselman is not related to singer James Brown, but he is the "hardest working man in public service." He goes to extraordinary measures to squeeze every cent in his budget to make the roads better. John is our featured speaker at the April 28 FCA meeting.

Springfield Township has over 400 streets. Of those 400 streets, nearly 92 miles of the roads are owned and maintained by Springfield Township. An additional 40 miles is considered to be county roads, which run through Springfield Township but are actually are owned and serviced by Hamilton County.

Springfield Township Roads

The Service Department of Springfield Township maintains most residential streets. Township neighborhood services and road improvement projects are provided through a combination of property tax dollars, gas taxes, and license taxes.

OHIO STATE KEEPS REVENUE GENERATED BY LOCAL FOLKS IS THE REASON FOR A JEDD

When Governor Kasich decided to keep local funds for himself as a rainy day fund, it produced tremendous financial pressure on local governments and individual tax payers. His rainy day fund has grown to over \$2 billion, while the Township budget has shrunk 65%. The Joint Economic Development District proposed by the Township is a last-resort effort to plug its budget. The FCA Board voted to support the JEDD at its December 2013 meeting. Chris Gilbert will be available at our April 28 FCA meeting to further explain the JEDD.
